AABA's programs help adoptive, foster, kinship care, and guardianship parents find resources in their community, so they can keep their children in their homes instead of placing them in institutions. AABA helps the parents to understand their children's bizarre behavior exhibited because of mental health issues due to early childhood traumas and maltreatment Parents will be better informed in finding the correct professional help for their children to heal from these early childhood traumas, and prevent some from trying suicide or mistreatment of others. advocacy through e-mails, community meetings, telephone counseling, individual meetings, and public awareness about early childhood issues.

*Workshops on Attachment Disorders: July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2009*

Alaska Attachment & Bonding Associates (AABA) has been offering workshops to adoptive, foster, and kinship care parents of children suffering trauma in early childhood suffering trauma in early childhood and professionals, for three years. AABA offers scholarships to parents and caregivers.

The workshops received outstanding reviews: "Better understanding of our kids." The next workshops will be offered in August 2008 and February and May 2009, with over 150 in attendance.

Attachment Issues knowledge is important in our community because of the severe neglect and abuse of children. Additional trauma is caused when children are removed from their birth parents' care and placed in a "new" family. The "new" parents are overwhelmed with their children's behavior.

AABA strives to support parents so they can maintain their children in their homes.

AABA's mission is to support healthy family attachments and bonds through education and advocacy.

Amount: \$10,000

*Sustainability for Marketing & Promotions: May 23, 2008 to June 30, 2009*

This Project is to advocate for People Parenting SED (Severe Emotionally Disturbed) Children. This project will benefit children who have experienced early childhood traumas. By helping parents find resources in their community, this project will assist parents to keep children in their homes instead of placing them in institutions. Also, finding resources for understanding their children's bizarre behaviors because of mental health issue due to early childhood traumas, parents will be better informed in finding the correct professional help for their children to heal from early childhood trauma.

This project will be developed using radio advertising, PSA's links with other web-sites, Community meetings, health Fairs throughout Alaska and newspaper advertising. The public will become aware of Alaska Attachment & Bonding Associates and recognize the services available to children and families. The web-site redesigns will reflect the information about services available in Alaska, which care for children with Reactive therapy, where to go for assessments, residential treatment centers that accept Denali Kid Care and Medicaid, and AABA's workshops. The new web-site will include an up-dated history of AABA, what's available in AABA's lending library, Signs and Symptoms and a definition of Reactive Attachment Disorder, and newsletters.

Marketing and Grant Writing Courses will help sustainability for Marketing, Promotions and Projected Growth. These courses will be taken by the Administrative Assistant and the CEO.

*AABA had the opportunity to market and promote the workshops on the KMBQ radio station's Community Corners and with KMBQ's PSA's ad package, which provided AABA with 240 radio ads with the support of Mat-Su Health Foundation (thank you!) and KMBQ's donation (thank you! John Klapperich and Becky Nichols). AABA was able to increase the workshop participation by 48%. And the awareness of Alaska Attachment & Bonding Associates has also increased. (We had participants at the May workshop that traveled from Missouri and Colorado.) AABA Web-site [www.akattachment](http://www.akattachment) has a new look with up-dated information and more information being added as it comes to AABA. AABA's administrative assistant has taken the grant writing course and received a Certificate of Completion from the online course. The Marketing course starts August 19, 2009.*

The first advanced workshop will be offered in May 2009. Reactive Attachment Disorder touches the lives of many, from parents, teachers, social workers, mental/medical providers, child care providers, police, attorneys and judges. The parents often look outside the community to an out-of-State treatment facility when they are unable to find services in their community. The day-to-day life with an emotionally traumatized child often leaves the parents believing they have no other choice than to send these children out-of-State.*

*These workshops will address the family's need for assistance and education in recognizing the symptoms and methods that benefit the families and deep them together.*
